RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE  
LEGAL SERVICES CORPORATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
AUGUST 10, 1992

WHEREAS, the Legal Services Corporation recognizes that the funding for legal needs of the poor is such that all programs are failing to meet the needs of their constituents, and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the foregoing, it is in the best interest of the poor of this country to fund programs proportional to their poverty population,

RESOLVED, that the Legal Services Corporation Board of Directors urges Congress for FY 1993 to achieve at least 90 percent equalization of funding for its grantees based on the 1990 Census (i.e., at least 90 percent of basic field funding allocated to the floor) by allocating increases in funding to floor-funded programs,


AND FURTHER RESOLVED that if 95 percent equalization of funding can be achieved for fiscal year 1994, that no programs be reduced in its funding as a result of the 1990 Census,


AND FURTHER RESOLVED that if 98.2 percent equalization of funding can be achieved by fiscal year 1995, that no program be reduced in its funding as a result of the 1990 Census,

AND FURTHER RESOLVED that if any of the above funding figures are not met, then the funding of individual programs be reduced in order to achieve the 90 percent equalization for fiscal year 1993, 95 percent equalization for fiscal year 1994, and 92 percent equalization for fiscal year 1995,

AND FURTHER RESOLVED that if funding in excess of these figures is received, that all such funding shall be allocated to achieve 100 percent equalization with all deliberate speed.
